SAFE UPDATE

The eight wellbeing indicators are the 'golden thread' through children's entire experience in our school. Each month we focus on a different wellbeing indicator to help our children understand and articulate the importance of the indicator in their daily lives.

During September we all focus on the indicator of feeling SAFE. We started this week with a successful fire drill to make sure every child knows what to do in the event of an emergency. Our whole school and nursery managed to evacuate the building in 3 minutes 29 seconds. Great job!

During our inspection, ALL P4-7 children reported that they felt safe in our school which is brilliant to hear. We regularly review our approaches to make sure our children know and feel safe, especially when they encounter experiences that may test this.

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Home Learning

Next week, teachers will be introducing home learning for children. The content and activities will vary across the school depending on your child's stage. Every child will bring home a reading book and we would encourage parents to read with their child/listen to their child read <u>every</u> day. Reading really is the key to success.

We will focus on literacy and numeracy tasks to support and reinforce learning. Some classes will send home weekly literacy and numeracy tasks, others will alternate each week. We plan to keep a record of who completes home learning to monitor any impact on learning. The research is mixed and home learning is optional for families. Please do not allow any home learning to cause stress for you or your child. We will gather your feedback in four weeks time to find out how home learning is going and what you feel could be improved. Changes we are making must be manageable for children, families and teachers too.

Some new home learning themes will include: * A balance of written and online activities * Introducing weekly handwriting home learning tasks to improve presentation and target core literacy * Introducing some written numeracy tasks



Article of the Week

We are working towards achieving our re-accreditation for the Rights Respecting Schools Gold Award. We have a strong rights based approach in St Ninian's with children's voice at the heart of everything we do.

We will focus on one article each week to ensure our school family know and understand the rights.

This week the focus is on Article 12 -Respect for Children's Views. We talked about this at Chatter Time today. Article 12 says that **every child has the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered and taken seriously**. We also learned that it does not mean that we always get what we want!

<u>Chatter Time task:</u> I have asked each class to create an Article 12 Box for their classroom so that children can share ideas, worries or views with pictures or words.

How can you help at home? Use the language of Article 12 when helping your child make decisions in their daily life and help them to respect the views of others too.


