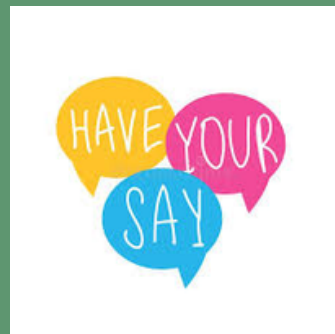
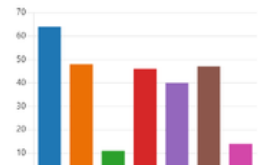
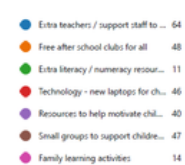


St Ninian's PS Pupil Equity Fund Summary 2024-2025

Pupil Voice

Pupil Voice is very important in St. Ninian's and we discuss with our learners how to best utilise our PEF money. Our learners have control of the Participatory Budget allowance which amounts to £1727. They are consulted on ways in which the money should be spent and the final decision is taken by a pupil vote.
